Membership Meetings

Thanks to our Programs Committee of Ginger Zozos and Peggy Gekas, the Fall Membership Meeting and the Spring Membership Meeting were great successes being held via Zoom.

The Fall Membership Meeting was held on October 27, 2020, with two very timely guest speakers. John Goldman, M.D., Infectious Disease Specialist, UPMC Pinnacle, provided an update on COVID-19 and its impact on our community. His presentation included information outlining the background of COVID-19 and discussed the virology, epidemiology, infectiousness, transmissibility, symptoms, and the importance of mitigation and vaccination.

Our second speaker was Peggy Jennings, Ed.D., who shared a presentation about Julia Jennings, Feminist: One Woman's Pursuit of the Vote. This was an inspiring presentation taking us back over 100 years, sharing her great-aunt's story of the suffragist struggle of the 19th amendment, which gave women the right to vote.

The Spring Membership Meeting was held on April 27, 2021, and featured Maria Olender, D.O., Medical Director of Hospice of Central Pennsylvania. Dr. Olender spoke on the differences between hospice and palliative care, providing insight and thoughtful points.

We hope that our future membership meetings can be in person. Watch the newsletter for information about those meetings and we hope you will join us – whether in person or via Zoom. As you can see, our Programs Committee is hard at work to provide meaningful content.

View from the Auxiliary Desk

When you write a check to the Pinnacle Health Auxiliary, it travels through UPMC Pinnacle Foundation offices before landing on our desk. Let's take the trip.

Sponsorships/Programs:

Since 2015, the Auxiliary has operated with the assistance of the Foundation staff. Checks written for events that include sponsorships, such as the gala or fashion show, go to Bev Bates, UPMC Pinnacle Database Coordinator. Bev enters the information in the computer program used by the Foundation and puts it into the designated category, such as reservations or raffle tickets. Your check then travels to Jodi Mattern, UPMC Pinnacle Foundation Executive Assistant, to prepare the deposit. After an event is over, the Treasurer (Cindy Banducci) and Assistant Treasurer (Dee McLaughlin) compare the totals and designations with Bev to reconcile an event.

Other Payments:

Checks written for things such as membership dues or smaller donations go directly to Jodi to be entered in the Foundation computer system and processed for deposit.

Coffee shop rent and vending machines proceeds pass through Jodi as well. Jodi produces a list of the checks by name, amount, and designation and makes up the Auxiliary bank deposit slip every two weeks or as needed. Jodi does this task at the request of the auditor. The deposit is kept in a locked drawer until Cindy or Dee collects it.

After the bank deposit is done, we enter the name, amount, check number and designation into our Auxiliary QuickBooks program. The income portion of the monthly Treasurer's report reflects your check's travels. If you ever have to track down a check or have questions, just reach out to Cindy or Dee. Cindy or Dee will go to the office to look up the payment and answer any questions.

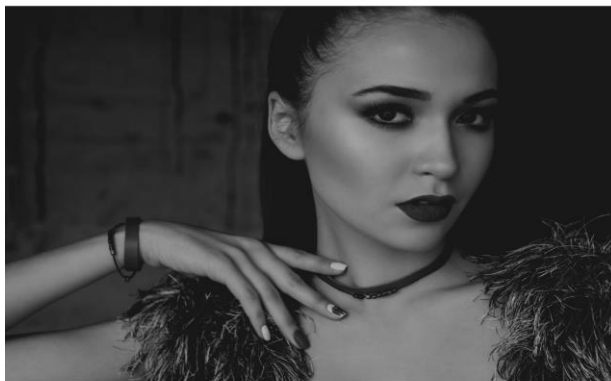
The team that put this event together was Anita Rash, Dimitri Zozos, Jan Lang, Teri Jakob, and Lynn Graham. Time well spent!!
